Somatic Engagement Part II, **Crossing Partitions** is a workgroup intended for those interested in investigating somatics as a field of pedagogy / practice / performance as research within and without Theatre / Dance / Performance Studies, by and for those within, outside or parallel to Academia.

Suggested inquiries are widely focused on what roles do Theatre / Dance / Performance Studies have in stewarding Somatics Studies in the 21st century Canada, within and beyond its own field. In particular, Somatics for sharing knowledge, as application to thoughts & practice & artistic expression has the potential to extend as somatic for social justice. What roles will Somatics Studies play, set as a pedagogy, practice, and performance as research, and addressed to the responsible performer in an era of ecocide, climate population dislocation, colonial & anti-colonial history, and Indigenous resurgence?

Participants are invited to submit proposals by February 1, our invitation to participate will follow by February 7. Selected participants will submit their papers (1200-1500 words) no later than April 22, 2020 to be shared and commented on through Google Drive. Following, participants will have one full month to engage with each other, divided into clusters according to content, until our meeting at the conference. We welcome contributions from the academic and professional arts sectors.

- An informal proposal (suggested 250 words; link to URL in case of images / sound)
- A short bio (200 words)

- What is your rationale for somatics as a contribution to research, and/ or a brief description of your artistic creative process.
